COMMENTS

One case was titled as Information concerning allegations of elderly abuse filed by the son. Allegations were against the sister, with the father as the victim. Victim was interviewed and denied any injuries. PIFR Deputy Chief Taylor, who responded to the residence at the request of the son, to treat the father's injuries, was also interviewed. DC Taylor advised that no injuries were noted, nor did the father complain of any injuries. Case closed as unfounded

Two larceny cases were filed by both town council candidates for seat 4. Both complained that campaign signs of theirs are being stolen from various locations in town. All locations were visited to ensure that property owners had authorized the signs being placed on their properties and to determine if any security cameras were in place to identify the perpetrators. No security cameras were located.
