Re: September 2020 Action Report

Chief Scales, the following report is a brief list of action items handled for the month. Please let me know if there are any area's in the following report you would like me to expand upon. Thank you.

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- In response to a request from the new Fire Marshal at the City of Deltona, we created a thumb drive loaded with information about fire prevention, firefighter training and community risk reduction that will educate new and veteran fire service personnel, based on the Sixth edition of the essentials manual. It is available to all of our surrounding and neighboring communities, as we rely on each other for automatic and mutual aid.
 - Replaced two ceiling fans in dorm rooms in FS-78.
 - Volusia County IT/Communications come to the station to check the dorm room closest to the electrical service for EMF (electromagnetic field). There is no EMF being emitted from the panel and the room and area registered "zero."
 - We held a September 11th remembrance ceremony on the 10th.
 - We placed a new US Flag at HQ just prior to the ceremony.
 - Reviewed the fire code changes to the upcoming 7th Edition of the Florida Fire Prevention Code which will take effect on 12-31-2020.
 - We submitted all the final documents and answered questions to Verisk for our ISO evaluation.
 - Placed a new water cooler on E-78.
 - Updated our "After the fire" handout.
 - Gave a fire safety speech and made a PPT presentation that focuses on kitchen fire safety in the home, to the Town Council on 9-17-2020.
 - Repaired SCBA 211(battery placement).
 - Responded to a fire to assist in Port Orange, 776 Falcon Drive-accidental.
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- Responded to a fire in South Daytona, Banana Key apartments-accidental, food on the stove. No reported injury, no fatality(s) in either fire, room and contents only on each fire.
 - Met the fire alarm technician at Town Hall, 4300 S. Atlantic to have him isolate the duct detector (#4) in a mechanical room due to moisture content. I instructed the tech to order a new detector (on order) and he will place it after October 1.
 - Inspected the generator room doors at 4650 Links Village and assisted them in finding the replacement product online, if they so choose. Took two chainsaws to John Deere implement for maintenance.
 - M-78 had been taken to New Smyrna Beach apparatus maintenance for many of the dash lights being on and the A/C stopping intermittently. We also had been draining the fuel separator of water quite frequently. I inquired to the shop supervisor if they could change the fuel separator and he stated they did not have that filter in stock. Napa auto parts had the filter and we changed it here at FS-78 and have no reported fuel separator problems or issues since placing the new filter. Just to verify that all of the diesel fuel at Public Works was of good quality and did not have an excess water content, we requested that the fuel vendor test the fuel and it came back as “under moisture content.”
 - Signed up for Live Fire Training Instructor which will run from October 6-10 at FSI.
 - I spoke with Fire Investigator William Brown of the ProNet Group, the parent insurance company for the fire on 8-1-2020 at 114 Marie Drive in Ponce Inlet. He informed me that after their complete and final investigation of the fire in question that “There finding as to the origin of the fire was exactly the same as the Ponce Inlet Fire Dept.”
